## **Message from the Principal**

January has been a busy month. South Slope and BCSD have been involved in a variety of learning activities. During literacy week Ms. Araujo and the literacy committee kept us all busy. On Monday January 22nd we kicked off the week with a fun filled assembly where the staff highlighted their acting skills by performing the story drama of the Little Red Hen staring Mr. Brown. We celebrated the importance of reading and literacy. As educators we instill the importance of reading in your child through a variety of activities and curricular areas but we know that students come to our schools every day with a love for books and learning that has been nurtured at home. Reading is one of the most important skills a child can learn. Prioritizing time to read at home each night has huge benefits, and helps your child build confidence and competence as a reader. Asking questions helps to develop your child's thinking skills and build comprehension. By now all FSA (Foundation Skills Assessments) results have been sent home with all students in Grades 4 and 7. If you have not seen these results and you are a parent of a Grade 4 or 7 student, please check the bottom of your child's backpack or contact me for a copy.

Please do not drive through the staff parking lot, slow down, drive alert and do not park in front of crosswalks as this blocks visibility. 


